MM PEACE BEGINS WITH YOUM



It is casino time again! We are looking for volunteers which will help us raise funds for the school. Every 2 years schools and other charitable/non-profit organizations are given a two-day time slot to provide volunteers to work at one of the Edmonton-area casinos in exchange for a portion of the profits. We generally earn between \$75,000 and \$80,000, so our volunteers for this event are crucial. This is by far the School Advisory Council's largest fundraiser. In the last 2 years, casino funds have paid for literacy supplies, math supplies, technology such as laptops and Chromebooks and new musical instruments for students. These funds help to purchase many large ticket items for the school and help to reduce the amount parents pay out of pocket.

There are a number of different jobs that you can sign up for and there is a professional advisor who will train the volunteers and is present to help out throughout the event. No prior experience or knowledge of casino games is expected. This is a great opportunity to meet other parents from the school and is a fun day/night out. A meal and snacks are provided free of charge for every



HOW IT WORKS



Step 2: Add Student ➤ Login and add your child(ren) to the account (name, province, city, school, grade).

Step 3: View Upcoming Lunches ➤ View the upcoming lunch dates.

Step 4: Place Your Orders And Make Payment Online ➤ Place your orders and make payment online with Visa or MasterCard.

*Orders can be placed for individual dates or for all available dates.

NOTE: If your child is absent on hot lunch day and you'd like to pick up his/her order, please contact the school by 10:30am. If no arrangements are made for pick up, his/her order will be donated to a student who does not have lunch. You can cancel orders up to the deadline date. If the order is not canceled, no refund can be issued.
